Overview

Homework will not be collected, but I will assume you have worked through the assigned problems and understand their solutions. Every 2-3 weeks we will take a short quiz (25 min) which will cover the previous 2-3 weeks' material. There will be one cumulative midterm exam on Thursday, 11/1. Each chapter ends with a sequence of exercises which will be assigned as homework. These lab assignments must be (physically) turned in at the beginning of the following week's lab.
